Mackintosh At The Willow (the original Willow Tea Rooms building) was exquisitely designed inside and out by Charles Rennie Mackintosh. It was opened in 1903 by successful Glasgow businesswoman Kate Cranston. The Art Nouveau treasure, filled with iconic Mackintosh furniture, is incredibly beautiful and inspiring and can be used as a launch pad for many types of creative learning. Perfect for looking at local history, art and design or even cake making – plan your visit today!


#### OPTION 2: A VISIT TO THE WILLOW

## MACKINTOSH SKETCHING TOUR DURATION: 45 mins


## STORM IN A TEACUP DRAMA WORKSHOP DURATION: 45mins


